The Importance of Proper Baptism

Everywhere they were water baptized in the name

of the Lord Jesus Christ. There is no power in the titles “Father, Son, and Holy Ghost.” No salvation or deliverance exists in these titles; they are not names at all. The name of Jesus is the name of the Father, the name of the Son, and the name of the Holy Ghost.

- Acts 2:38 emphasizes that baptism in Jesus’ name is essential for the remission of sins.

The demonational churches, particularly the Trinitarians, have not properly interpreted the Scriptures with proper hermeneutics, which is the art and science of interpretation of the Word of God. They take a text and try to build a doctrine on that verse, but there is no Trinity in that verse; it is asking for the proper name—not names, but name in the sentence.

The name of Jesus is the name of the Father (Isaiah 9:6) and Matthew 1:21-23. The angel declared that Emmanuel’s name is Jesus. The everlasting Father’s name is Jesus (John 5:43 and Philipppians 2:10). The name of Jesus is the name of the one true God.
