# A Call to the Revelation of Oneness, Water Baptism in Jesus' Name, and the Baptism with the Holy Ghost and Fire with the evidence of speaking in tongues

## Introduction

There is a stirring across the World and a revelation that's coming to the denominational religious institutions. It is a coming out of the catholic-trinitarian, three gods cult to the true Church of the Living God. The Apostolic-Pentecostal Jesus' Name bride is the church and the body of Christ through the Acts 2:38 experience. There is a revealing of the oneness of the Godhead, a call to return to Apostolic practice, and a prophetic outpouring known among many as the "third pull."

This booklet is a pastoral and prophetic call: to receive the revelation that Jesus is the Word of God; the Father incarnate, to obey Acts 2:38 in baptism "in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins," and to seek the baptism in the Holy Ghost and fire with the evidence of speaking in tongues. It is written to equip, encourage, and commission the Bride for the greatest Apostolic-Pentecostal revival.

## Chapter 1 — The Revelation of Oneness

- Core truth: God is one (Deut. 6:4). In the New Testament God is fully revealed in Jesus Christ — the Word made flesh (John 1:1–14). The revelation of oneness affirms that Jesus is the manifestation of the Father and the fullness of the Godhead bodily.
- Why this matters: Theology shapes worship and practice. Seeing Jesus as the revealed Father leads believers to worship, confess, and call upon the name of Jesus as God revealed.
- Key texts: John 1:1–14; Colossians 2:9; Hebrews 1:3.

## Chapter 2 — Jesus: God the Father Manifested in the Flesh

- The incarnation is God’s self-revelation. Jesus is not a lesser third party; in Him the fullness of the Godhead dwells (Col. 1:19; 2:9).
- Practical implication: Prayer, worship, and the baptizing name center on Jesus — the revealed Name of God.
- Scripture anchors: John 14:9; Hebrews 1:3; Romans 8:3.

## Chapter 3 — Apostolic Doctrine: Acts 2:38 Restored

- Acts 2:38 states the apostolic pattern: repent, be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and receive the gift of the Holy Ghost.

- Restoration means returning to the New Testament order: repentance, water baptism in Jesus' name, and expectation of the Spirit's endowment.
- Read: Acts 2:38; Acts 4:12; Acts 8; Acts 10–11; Acts 19:1–6.

## Chapter 4 — Water Baptism in Jesus' Name

- Biblical form: Baptism “in the name of Jesus Christ” (Acts 2:38; Acts 8:16; Acts 10:48; Acts 19:5).
- Why the formula matters: The apostolic pattern associates the authority and covenant name of the Lord with remission of sins and entrance into the new covenant community.
- Practical liturgy:
- Candidate confession: testimony of repentance and faith in Jesus as Lord and God.
- Baptismal words: “I baptize you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins.” (Administer immersion.)
- Prayer and laying on of hands to receive the Holy Ghost.
- Pastoral note: Baptism should be accompanied by discipleship and connection to a believing community that upholds apostolic doctrine.

## Chapter 5 — The Baptism in the Holy Ghost and Fire: Evidence of Tongues

- Promise and pattern: Jesus promised the Father and power from on high (Luke 24:49; Acts 1:4–8). The early church received the Holy Ghost with tongues as the initial evidence (Acts 2; 10:44–46; 19:1–6).
- What to expect: A real encounter with the Spirit that empowers for witness, sanctifies, and builds intimate fellowship with God. Speaking in tongues is the biblical sign that the baptism has occurred.
- How to seek:
  - Ask in faith (Luke 11:13).
  - Pray and wait in expectancy.
  - Have leaders or elders pray and lay hands (Acts 8:14–17; 19:6).
  - Be yielded; speak as the Spirit gives utterance (Acts 2:4, 1 Cor. 14:2–4).
  - The fire: Purifying, empowering, and manifesting holiness and zeal.

## Chapter 6 — The Third Pull and the Final Exodus

- The “third pull” describes a prophetic, intensified outpouring and a mass return to Apostolic, Jesus-name faith. It follows previous moves and will be characterized by:
  - A great turning of hearts to Apostolic doctrine and practice.
  - Multitudes leaving denominational systems that have departed from New Testament order.
  - A harvest of souls and reformation in homes and



local assemblies.

- Scriptural themes: Revelation 10:7 (mystery finished), Revelation 17–18 (call to come out of Babylon), Joel 2 (spirit poured out on all flesh).
- Pastoral encouragement: Expect both blessing and opposition; remain rooted in Scripture and obedient to apostolic practice.

## Chapter 7 — Come Out: Leaving Denominational Structures

- Biblical call to come out of religious systems that obstruct true worship (Rev. 18:4).
- Practical steps:
- Examine teachings: Are baptism and Spirit evidence practiced as in Acts? Is Jesus central as the revealed Name of God?
- Repent personally of unbelief or compromise.
- Find or form a community committed to the Apostolic faith: oneness theology, Jesus-name baptism, gifts of the Spirit, holiness.
- Be loving in testimony — aim to win, not to alienate.
- Caution: “Coming out” is spiritual, not merely institutional. Leave errors, not people; pursue restoration where possible.

## Chapter 8 — Objections and Answers (Common Questions)

- “Is the doctrine of the Trinity biblical?” — Answer: The Trinity language is not a New Testament formula; Oneness teaching appeals to the plain witness of Scripture that Jesus reveals the Father. Encourage careful, Scripture-centered study.
- “Are tongues necessary?” — Answer: In the apostolic pattern tongues are the initial evidence of Spirit baptism. Expect it as a biblical sign while recognizing God’s sovereign work.
- “What about unity?” — Answer: True unity is built on truth and the person of Jesus. Unity should not require abandoning apostolic confession.

## Chapter 9 — The Life of the Apostolic Bride: Discipleship and Holiness

- Apostolic life: Prayer, holiness, evangelism, baptismal obedience, and Spirit empowerment.
- Daily disciplines:
- Scripture meditation and confession (Josh. 1:8; Ps. 119:11).
- Regular times of prayer and seeking the Spirit (John 6:63; John 15:3–5).
- Fellowship with other believers in the Apostolic faith.
- Leadership: Raise up apostles, prophets, evangelists, pastors, and teachers who adhere to apostolic doctrine and practice (Eph. 4:11–16).



## Chapter 10 — Corporate Revival: Worship, Prophecy, and Testimony

- Revival is corporate: expressive worship, prophetic declaration, repentance, and public testimony.
- Practice prophetic worship with expectancy; use testimonies to build faith. Record and share answers to prayer.
- Maintain order (1 Cor. 14) while embracing the Spirit's freedom.

## Chapter 11 — Prayers, Confessions, and Liturgy

- Invocation for seeking the Holy Ghost:  
“Father, send the promise of Your Spirit. Jesus, baptize us with the Holy Ghost and fire. Fill us now; speak through us. We expect tongues as the evidence of Your gift.”
- Baptismal confession example:  
“I repent and turn to Jesus. I believe Jesus is Lord and God, and I am baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of my sins.”
- Daily confession examples:
  - “I am born again in Christ; the old is gone, the new is come.” (2 Cor. 5:17)
  - “I have received the Holy Ghost; I speak with other tongues as the Spirit gives utterance.” (Acts 2; 1 Cor. 14:2)
- Corporate declaration:

“We are the Bride. We call on the name of Jesus. We will obey Acts 2:38 and carry the fire of the Holy Ghost into every land.”

## Chapter 12 — Practical Steps to Prepare and Participate

- If you seek the baptism in Jesus’ name and Holy Ghost:

1. Repent — genuine turning from sin.
  2. Confess faith in Jesus as LORD and God.
  3. Be baptized by immersion in the name of Jesus Christ.
  4. Pray and ask for the Holy Ghost; invite elders to lay hands and pray.
  5. Expect tongues as initial evidence; practice speaking as the Spirit enables.
- Form a house fellowship or join an Apostolic assembly if local options are limited.
  - Keep a testimony journal of encounters and answered prayers.

## Chapter 13 — Warnings and Discernment

- Watch for counterfeit experiences and pride. Test manifestations by Scripture and fruit.
- Hold fast to doctrine and order — spiritual experience must be governed by apostolic truth and humility.

- Keep charity and patience toward those still in error; call with compassion, not contempt.

## Chapter 14 — Resources and Suggested Reading

- Scripture reading plan: Acts (esp. 2, 8, 10, 19), John, Romans, 1 Corinthians (esp. 12–14), Revelation 10 & 17–18.
- Recommended themes to study: Oneness theology, New Testament baptismal practice, early church practice.
- Connect with Apostolic Pentecostal teachers, local fellowships, and small groups committed to Scripture and Spirit.

## Conclusion — Arise, Bride!

The Lord is calling His APOSTOLIC PENTECOSTAL JESUS NAME Bride into the fullness of revelation: the oneness of God revealed in Jesus, the apostolic formula of Acts 2:38, and the baptism with the Holy Ghost and fire with the evidence of speaking in tongues. This is not merely a doctrine but a life — repentant, Water baptized in Jesus Name only, Spirit-filled with the evidence of speaking in tongues, holy, and sent. Prepare your heart, gather with those who believe, and expect a powerful outpouring. The third pull is a call to return, to be renewed, and to carry the fire of God into a world that needs Jesus.
