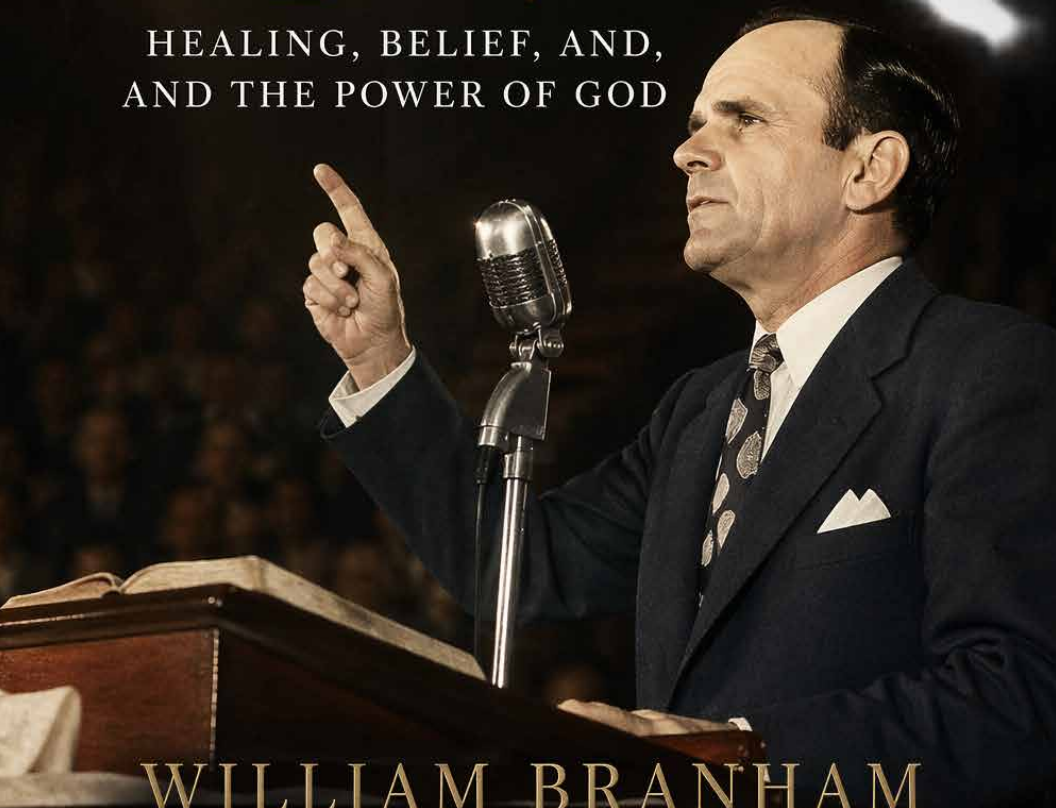

Introduction

The ministry of William Branham has been regarded by many as a significant move of the Spirit of God in the 20th century. His preaching emphasized faith, divine healing, and a return to the supernatural power seen in the early church.

Supporters of his ministry connect it to biblical passages such as Malachi 4:5–6, Luke 17:30, and Revelation 10:7—interpreting these Scriptures as pointing to a restoration of spiritual truth and power before the return of Jesus Christ.

This booklet does not attempt to settle every theological debate, but instead focuses on a central theme evident throughout the message: faith in God brings real results.

Our prayer is that as you read, the Word of God will move from the page into your heart.

Chapter 1: A Faith That Works

In one of his sermons, Branham spoke of mustard seed faith—a small but genuine faith that produces real results.

Jesus said that even faith as small as a mustard seed can move mountains. The emphasis is not on the size of faith, but its genuineness and persistence.

Many struggle because they compare their faith to others:

- Some seem to have great faith
- Others feel they have very little

But the message is simple:

If your faith is real, stay with it

Faith is not emotion.

Faith is not sight.

Faith is trust in what God has already said.

Chapter 2: Healing and Belief

A major emphasis in Branham's ministry was divine healing.

He taught that:

- Healing was provided through Christ
- Faith is the channel through which healing is received
- Belief must be accepted, not just hoped for

He often encouraged people to act on their belief:

“Believe that you're healed... accept it... and thank God.”

This reflects the biblical pattern:

- Faith comes first
- Manifestation follows

Chapter 3: Faith vs. Sight

One of the greatest obstacles to receiving from God is reliance on natural sight.

Scripture teaches that we walk by faith, not by sight.

This means:

- You may still feel symptoms
- You may not see immediate change
- Circumstances may look the same

But faith says:

“God has spoken, and that settles it.”

Understanding replaces doubt when faith is rooted in God’s Word.

Chapter 4: The Role of the Supernatural

Branham's ministry included reports of visions, healings, and supernatural insight.

Whether one fully agrees with every claim or not, the underlying principle is biblical:

- God is not limited to natural means
- The Holy Spirit works in ways beyond human understanding
- Signs and wonders are meant to point people to God

However, it is important to remember:

- The Word of God is the foundation
- Experiences must align with Scripture

Chapter 5: Christ—The Center of Everything

At the heart of the message is Jesus Christ.

The sermon emphasizes:

- Christ took our place
- Sin and sickness were dealt with at Calvary
- Salvation and healing are received through faith

Key truth:

What Christ has already done must be received, not earned

It is not by works, effort, or human merit—but by faith.

Chapter 6: A Call to Personal Faith

One of the strongest themes is personal responsibility in faith.

You do not need:

- A special setting
- A certain person
- A specific moment

Faith can work right where you are.

The question becomes:

- Do you believe?
- Will you accept what God has promised?

Conclusion

The message throughout this booklet is simple but powerful:

- God is real
- Faith is essential
- Christ has already provided

Whether in healing, salvation, or daily life, the principle remains:

Believe God—and stay with it.
