Foundational Laws of Preaching

7. Law of Authority: Establish credibility and authority to enhance the message's persuasive power.

8. Law of Anticipation: Create curiosity and expectation about the message to keep the audience engaged.

9. Law of Feedback: Foster a two-way communication process that clarifies misunderstandings and builds community.

10. Law of Application: Provide practical applications of the message to facilitate real-life change.

Additional Laws of Pentecostal Preaching

 Law of Anointing: The Holy Spirit's anointing (Acts 10:38) enhances the effectiveness of preaching, transforming the message and touching hearts.

2. Law of Spiritual Authority: Operate under divine authority (Luke 10:19; Acts 1:4-8; Acts 19:1-6; Matt 28:18; Matt 18:18-20; Matt 16:18-19) to compel listeners to respond with faith and obedience.

3. Law of Prophetic Utterance: Incorporate prophetic elements to speak forth God's will, encouraging conviction and action.

4. Law of Faith Activation: Activate faith in listeners by proclaiming God's promises and encouraging belief in the supernatural (Hebrews 11:1-6).

5. Law of Spiritual Encounter: Create an atmosphere for personal encounters with God, involving worship, prayer, and spiritual gifts.

6. Law of Holistic Transformation: Aim for transformation in spirit, soul, and body, not just intellectual understanding.

7. Law of Community and Belonging: Foster a sense of belonging and mutual support among congregants in their spiritual journeys.

8. Law of Testimony: Share testimonies of God's work to reinforce the message and encourage faith.

9. Law of Urgency: Convey a sense of urgency regarding salvation and spiritual awakening to prompt immediate responses.

10. Law of Spiritual Warfare: Address the reality of spiritual warfare, equipping the congregation to stand firm in faith.

11. Law of the Preaching of the Cross of Calvary: Center the message on the cross of the Lord Jesus Christ, emphasizing hope, redemption, and empowerment.

12. Law of the Holy Spirit's Guidance: Be sensitive to

the Holy Spirit's leading during messages, allowing for spontaneous ministry moments.

13. Law of Revelation: Pentecostal preaching is to expound the Word of God with revelation, knowledge, and understanding to the saints, illuminating the truths of Scripture through the Holy Spirit.

14. Law of the Baptism in the Holy Ghost and Fire: Essential to Pentecostal preaching is being filled with the Holy Ghost and fire, evidenced by speaking in tongues and water baptism in Jesus' name (Luke 24:49; Acts 1:4-8; Acts 2:1-38-39). This empowerment distinguishes Pentecostal preachers from their denominational counterparts, enabling them to preach with authority and effectiveness.

These principles collectively highlight the interplay between the preacher, the congregation, and the Holy Spirit, emphasizing that effective preaching in a Pentecostal context involves more than mere communication of ideas.
