THERE IS A WAY TO BE HEALED EVERY TIME

1. Anointing with Oil

10. Revelation 21:4 - "And God shall wipe away all tears from their eyes; and there shall be no more death, neither sorrow, nor crying, neither shall there be any more pain: for the former things are passed away."

2. Acts 3:19 - "Repent ye therefore, and be converted, that your sins may be blotted out, when the times of refreshing shall come from the presence of the Lord."

3. John 3:3-8 - Jesus explains the necessity of being born again of water and spirit.

4.
