Introduction

There are realms in God that are not accessed by walking — they are accessed by flight.

Throughout Scripture, the eagle represents elevation, vision, renewal, and divine stirring. The prophet is likened to the eagle because he does not live at ground level. He sees from above. He hears in the heights. He speaks what he sees from the throne perspective.

The perch of the prophet is the high place of communion with the Lord Jesus christ who is the Holy Ghost in us with the evidence of speaking in tongues.



Chapter 1

The Call to the Heights

Isaiah 40:31

“They shall mount up with wings as eagles...”

Mounting requires exchange. Waiting produces wings.

The prophet does not climb by ambition.



He is lifted by Spirit
wind.

Just as the Golden
Eagle rides thermal
currents over desert
mountains, the prophet
rides the currents of
the Holy Ghost.

The eagle does
not waste strength
flapping endlessly. It
discerns the wind.

The prophet must discern the wind of the Spirit.



Chapter 2

The Stirring of the Nest

Deuteronomy 32:11

“As an eagle stirreth up her nest...”

Before flight comes discomfort.

The eagle pushes its young out so they learn
dependence on air instead of branches.

The perch of the prophet is not comfort — it is consecration.

God will:

- Disturb routine
- Break familiarity
- Remove shallow security

Not to destroy — but to develop wings.



Every true prophetic mantle begins with a stirred nest.



Chapter 3

The Perch Above the Storm

Eagles do not fear storms.
They ascend above them.

Storm winds create lift.
The prophet's trials become thermals.

Where others panic, the prophet gains altitude.

The perch of the prophet is not found in sunshine —

It is established in storm mastery.



This echoes your revelation:
The eagle in the night
flying into realms mortal
man cannot go.

The night is where
revelation is given.

Job 33:15–16

God opens the ear in the night.

The perch is accessed in dark hours of prayer.



Chapter 4

The Face of the Eagle – Heavenly Vision

Ezekiel 1:10

The living creatures had the face of an eagle.

The eagle face represents:

- Revelation
- Discernment
- Heavenly dimension

The prophet does not speak from information.

He speaks from sight.

Eagles can see miles away.



Prophetic vision:

- Sees danger before it arrives
- Sees destiny before manifestation
- Sees spiritual climate shifts

The perch gives perspective.

Chapter 5

Carried on Eagles' Wings

Exodus 19:4

“I bare you on eagles’ wings...”

Before the prophet ever flies — he is carried.

The first eagle experience is deliverance.

No man perches who has not first been lifted out of Egypt.

This connects to covenant identity according to Acts 2:38 Bible salvation; the new birth of water and spirit experience. God brings His people to Himself before He sends them forth.

The perch is not a platform. It is proximity and it's a position in the fivefold ministry and gifts of helps for Golden Eagle Saints in the Bride–Body of Christ.



Chapter 6

Renewal and Molting

Eagles shed old feathers.



Seasons of silence are molting seasons. The prophet disappears before he reappears stronger.

Isaiah 40:31 shows renewal is linked to waiting. The perch sometimes looks like isolation.

But isolation is incubation.



Chapter 7

The Difference Between Eagle and Vulture

Though the Hebrew word neshar can describe large soaring birds like the Griffon Vulture, spiritually there is a distinction:



- The eagle hunts living revelation.
- The vulture feeds on decay.

False prophetic voices feed on controversy.
True prophetic voices feed on communion.

The perch of the prophet is not a place of scavenging
—It is a place of seeing.



Chapter 8

The Perch and the Night Realms

The eagle flies at heights unreachable by ordinary birds.

The prophet enters dimensions accessed through:

- Prayer
- Fasting
- Consecration
- Deep intercession



In the night watches, the perch becomes a throne-room vantage point.

The eagle does not announce its altitude.

It simply soars.

The true prophet does not advertise revelation.

He trembles under it.

INTRODUCTION

The Eagle and the Apostles' Doctrine

The eagle in Scripture is not merely symbolic of mystical height — it is symbolic of Spirit-borne elevation.

True prophetic flight is impossible without:

Acts 2:38

- Repentance
- Water baptism in the Name of Jesus Christ
- The baptism of the Holy Ghost with the evidence of speaking in tongues.

Without the new birth, there are no wings.

The perch of the prophet is not accessed by intellect.

Apostolic Elevation

Chapter 1

Born From Below, Raised Above

John 3:3–5

Except a man be born of water and Spirit...

The Greek word for Spirit:

πνεῦμα (pneuma)

Meaning:

- Breath
- Wind
- Spirit

The same wind that lifts the eagle (ruach / pneuma)
is the Holy Ghost and fire with the evidence of
speaking in tongues

The Apostolic believer does not mount up by talent.
He mounts up by Holy Ghost infilling.

Speaking in tongues is the first sound of lift-off.



Chapter 2

The Name That Establishes the Perch

Acts 4:12

Neither is there salvation in any other name.

The perch is covenant position.

Water baptism in Jesus' Name:

- Establishes legal authority
- Places the believer under blood covenant
- Grants access to heavenly places

Ephesians 2:6

“Raised us up together...”

Raised = elevated position.

The eagle believer lives from a raised position
because he has been baptized into Christ.



Chapter 3

The Stirring of Holiness

The stirred nest (Deuteronomy 32:11) prophetically represents sanctification.

Hebrew word for holy:

קָדוֹשׁ (qadosh)

Meaning:

- Set apart
- Separate
- Sacred

The perch requires separation.

Apostolic holiness is not legalism — it is altitude protection.

You cannot soar if you are entangled.

Worldliness clips wings.

Holiness preserves lift.



Chapter 4

Sonship and Authority

Romans 8:15 — Spirit of adoption.

Greek word for adoption:

υιοθεσία (huiiothesia)

Meaning:

- Placement as a son

Sons fly differently than servants.

The eagle believer understands covenant identity.

The perch is a son's seat — not a hireling's ladder.

Chapter 5

Praying in the Night — Tongues as Flight

Jude 20

“Building up yourselves... praying in the Holy Ghost.”

Greek:

ἐποικοδομοῦντες (epoikodomountes)

Meaning:

- Building upon
- Strengthening a foundation

Praying in tongues:

- Strengthens spiritual altitude
- Increases sensitivity
- Deepens revelation

Tongues are not emotional expression.

They are night-flight navigation.



Chapter 6

Fire in the Darkness

Acts 2:3

Cloven tongues like as of fire.

Fire in Hebrew:

אֵשׁ (esh)

Fire purifies before it empowers.

The eagle anointing requires fire before flight.

A church without fire may gather — but it cannot soar.

Chapter 7

Midnight Deliverance — Apostolic Authority

Acts 16:25

At midnight they prayed and sang.

Darkness did not silence them.

Authority in Jesus' Name breaks chains.

The perch produces authority.

The wings exercise it.

Chapter 8

The Bride With Eagle Wings

Revelation 12:14

Two wings of a great eagle.

The Bride is elevated above the dragon.

Only a Spirit-filled Bride can endure last-day darkness.

Oil in the lamp = Holy Ghost.

No oil, no night flight.



Chapter 9

The Prophetic Watchman in the Last Days

Ezekiel 3 — Watchman.

The Apostolic preacher is a watchman.

The perch gives:

- Warning vision
- Discernment of spirits
- Doctrinal clarity

The Holy Ghost guards against false wind (false doctrine).

Every wind is not ruach.

Only the wind aligned with Acts 2:38 lifts safely.



Chapter 10

The Difference Between Emotionalism

and Eagle Anointing

Not all spiritual excitement is elevation.

True elevation produces:

- Holiness
- Humility
- Boldness in Jesus' Name
- Submission to apostolic pentecostal authority
- Burden for souls

False flight produces pride.

The true eagle trembles under revelation.

The Perch = Covenant Position

The Wings = Holy Ghost Power

The Night = Testing & Intercession

The Storm = Spiritual Promotion

The Fire = Purification

The Name of Jesus = Authority

Tongues = Evidence of the baptism in the Holy Ghost is when you are born of the spirit with the sign of sonship which is speaking in tongues as the spirit

gives evidence is the seal of the Holy Ghost and water baptism in Jesus Name is to be born of the water is to be born into sonship
