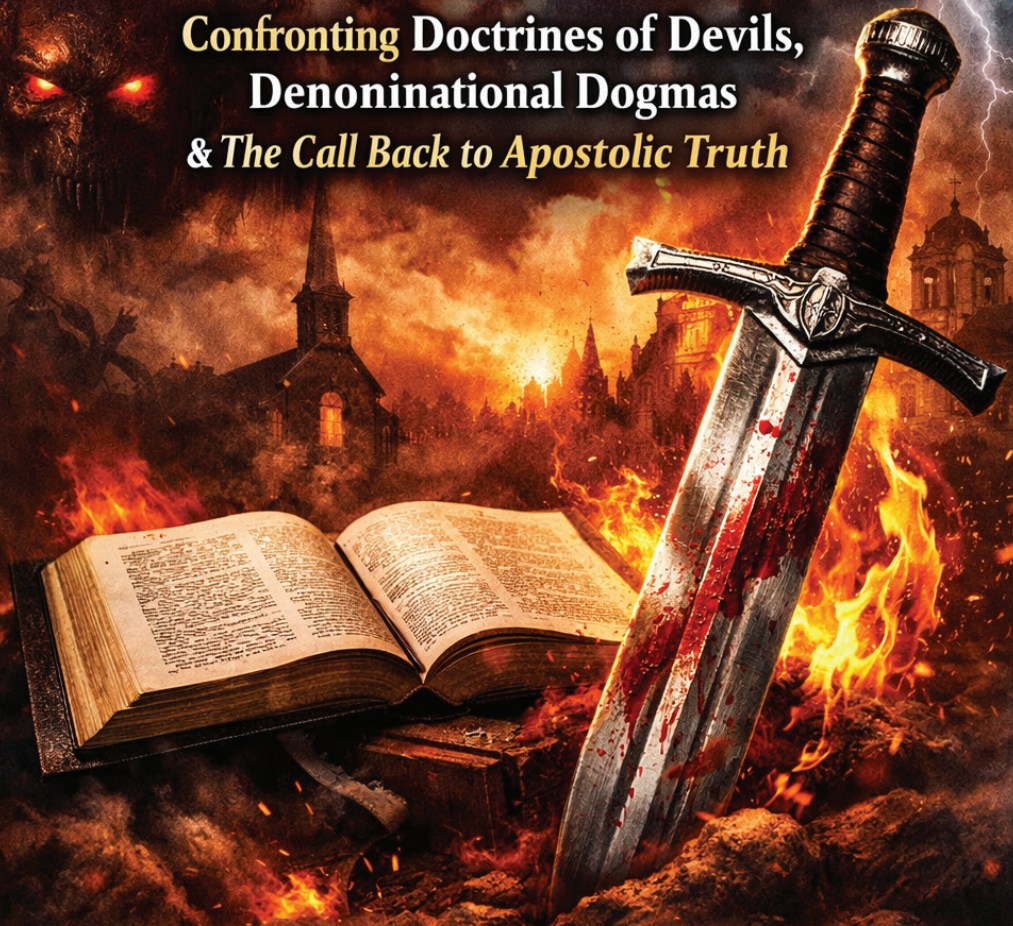

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Preface

We are not in a passive hour—we are in a spiritual war.

This is not a war fought with natural weapons, but with truth, revelation, and the power of the Holy Ghost. The battlefield is not physical territory—it is doctrine, truth, and the souls of men.

From pulpits to platforms, from seminaries to denominations, false doctrines have crept in—subtle, persuasive, and deadly. These are not harmless differences; they are eternal issues. Heaven and hell stand in the balance.

Chapter 1: The Reality of Spiritual Warfare

The early Church in the Book of Acts had:

- One doctrine
- One message
- One experience
- One name—Jesus Christ

Denominations were born when men:

- Began to interpret Scripture through tradition
- Established systems rather than submitting to revelation
- Divided what God made one

Paul rebuked this spirit in 1 Corinthians 1:12–13:

“Every one of you saith, I am of Paul; and I of Apollos... Is Christ divided?”

Denominationalism replaces:

- Revelation with tradition
- Power with form
- Truth with compromise

Chapter 4: The Oneness of God vs. Religious Tradition

The greatest battleground is the identity of God.

The Bible declares in Deuteronomy 6:4:

“Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God is one LORD.”

The fullness of that one God was revealed in Jesus Christ.

Colossians 2:9 declares:

“For in him dwelleth all the fulness of the Godhead bodily.”

The Apostles never preached titles—they preached the NAME.

Chapter 5: The Name Above Every Name

Acts 4:12 declares:

“Neither is there salvation in any other: for there is none other name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved.”

That name is Jesus.

The Apostles:

- Baptized in the name of Jesus Christ (Acts 2:38)
- Preached remission of sins in His name
- Cast out devils in His name
- Healed the sick in His name

The name of Jesus is:

- The covenant name
- The redemptive name
- The saving name

To reject the name is to reject the power.

Chapter 6: Acts 2:38 — The Apostolic Blueprint

Acts 2:38 is not a suggestion—it is the divine command for salvation:

“Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost.”

This is the pattern:

1. Repentance
2. Water baptism in Jesus’ name
3. Receiving the Holy Ghost with the evidence of speaking in tongues

Anything less is incomplete.

Anything different is error.

Modern religion seeks:
