Many Oneness Apostolic Pentecostal missionaries exemplified this steadfastness, enduring imprisonment and even martyrdom for their beliefs. Below is a list of notable missionaries who remained unwavering in their faith, along with their inspiring stories.

Oneness Apostolic Pentecostal Missionaries Who Stood Firm
