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Introduction

The last days call for a fresh visitation of the Holy Spirit — a return to power, signs, and salvation as recorded in the Book of Acts. This booklet is written for Apostolic Pentecostal congregations and seekers who long for revival, miraculous healing, and clear guidance from God. It draws on biblical teaching about God’s work through His servants, the operation of the gifts of the Spirit, the call to holy living, and practical guidelines for praying for the sick and ministering in public meetings.

The Purpose of God’s Visitations

- God visits His people to restore, to warn, and to prepare the Church for the coming of the Lord (Acts 2; Hebrews 12:25–29).
- Signs and wonders confirm the message of salvation and validate the ministry of those sent by God (Mark 16:17–20; Hebrews 2:3–4).
- Revival is not an end in itself but a means to awaken repentance, faith, and obedience.

The Holy Spirit and Divine Healing

- Healing belongs to the redemptive work of Christ. Jesus healed the sick as a sign of the Kingdom (Matthew 8:16–17; Isaiah 53:4–5).

- The Church today can expect God’s healing power when His will is sought in faith and prayer (James 5:14–16).
- The gifts of healing and miracles are for the edifying of the Body and the confirmation of the Gospel (1 Corinthians 12:7–11).

God Uses Men — Be an Instrument

- God chooses and uses human vessels to carry His message and power (Acts 3:6–8; Acts 9:17–18).
- Ministry must be exercised in humility, dependence on the Spirit, and obedience to Scripture. Gifts are not to be exploited for personal acclaim.
- Ministers and lay people alike should cultivate holiness, prayerfulness, and a teachable spirit so God can work through them.

The Gifts in Operation

- Expect the Holy Spirit to manifest in prophetic utterance, discernment, healing, and other gifts (1 Corinthians 14; Romans 12:6–8).
- Discernment is essential: compare prophecies and words with Scripture; the fruit of the Spirit and transformation of lives are marks of authenticity (Galatians 5:22–23).
- Respect order in public ministry: love, edification, and clarity must guide the operation of gifts (1

Corinthians 14:26–40).

Apostolic Doctrine — Salvation, Baptism, and the Spirit

- Repentance toward God and baptism in the Name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins remain central to Apostolic Pentecostal faith (Acts 2:38; Acts 4:12).
- The infilling of the Holy Spirit with the initial sign of speaking in tongues is still expected and prayed for (Acts 2:4; Acts 10:44–46).
- Teachings must lead people into a personal relationship with Jesus — Savior, Lord, and Healer.

How to Pray for the Sick — Practical Guidelines

- Prepare: leaders should pray and seek the Spirit's direction before ministering publicly.
- Invite faith: call people to believe and to come forward in an orderly way (Acts 3:1–10; Mark 5:25–34).
- Lay hands in faith: scriptural practice includes laying on of hands and praying in faith (Mark 16:18; James 5:14).
- Expect varied outcomes: God knows His will. Some are healed immediately, others gradually, and some receive spiritual strengthening rather than physical healing.
- Follow-up: encourage healed ones to testify,

get medical follow-up if needed, and continue in discipleship.

Conducting a Prayer Line or Healing Service

- Keep the priority on God and His Word; avoid spectacle. Let the Holy Spirit determine who is to be ministered to and how.
- Maintain order: ushers, a set route for the line, clear instructions, and gentleness toward the ill and the elderly.
- Public testimony strengthens the congregation's faith. Invite those healed to speak briefly so the church may glorify God.
- Protect the vulnerable: do not pressure or exploit the sick. Treat each person with dignity.

The Call to Holiness and Repentance

- Revival brings conviction. Genuine encounters with God produce repentance and new obedience (Acts 2:37–41).
- Holiness of life opens us to sustained blessing; sin and compromise hinder the Spirit's freely given power (1 Peter 1:15–16).
- Encourage practical steps: prayer, Bible study, separation from known sin, reconciliation, and faithful worship.

Testimonies — The Church's Living Proof

- Testimonies are not curiosities; they are living proof that God still intervenes (Psalm 66:16; Revelation 12:11).
- Record and share testimonies responsibly: include names, the nature of the need, how God met it, and a short affirmation of continued discipleship.

The Church in the Last Days

- The Scriptures warn of coming judgment, but they also promise a final harvest and the gathering of the faithful (Revelation 7; Matthew 24:14).
- The Church's task is to preach repentance, make disciples, care for the needy, and proclaim the Kingdom through word and deed.
- Stay watchful, prayerful, and unified in Christ as signs increase and the return of the Lord draws near.

How You Can Prepare Personally

- Repent and commit: make confession, be baptized in Jesus' Name, and pursue the infilling of the Holy Spirit.
- Pray earnestly: set aside time daily for Bible reading, intercession, and thanksgiving.
- Serve faithfully: use your gifts to build up the Body of Christ, minister to the poor and sick, and support

revival efforts.

- Testify: when God answers, declare His goodness publicly and encourage others to seek Him.

Sample Prayers

- Prayer for Healing: “Lord Jesus, You are the same yesterday, today, and forever. I believe You bore my sickness on the cross. In the Name of Jesus, I ask You to touch and heal (mention the need). Strengthen my faith and grant me what is best for Your glory. Amen.”
- Prayer for Infilling: “Father, I repent of my sins and desire to be filled with Your Holy Spirit. Baptize me now by faith. I receive speaking with other tongues as the evidence of Your Spirit. Fill me, empower me, and send me forth. In Jesus’ Name. Amen.”
- Prayer for Revival: “Almighty God, send a fresh outpouring of Your Spirit on this city and on Your Church. Awaken us to holiness, stir our hearts to pray, and let signs and wonders confirm the Gospel. Use us as instruments of Your grace. In Jesus’ Name. Amen.”

Resources and Further Reading

- The Holy Bible (read Acts, the Gospels, 1 Corinthians 12–14, James 5).
- Hymns, testimony collections, and local church materials on baptism and Spirit baptism.

- Local Apostolic Pentecostal pastors and elders for discipleship and counsel.

Conclusion — A Call to Faith

God still moves in power today. He calls His people to faith, holiness, and service. If you hunger for revival, seek the Lord with a sincere heart, be baptized in the Name of Jesus Christ, pursue the fullness of the Holy Spirit, and serve others in love. God will confirm His Word with signs following — healing the sick, delivering the oppressed, and bringing many to repentance.
