



# EAGLE SAINTS

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*– Part 3 –*

*Seated with Christ in  
Heavenly Places*

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- Exodus 19:4

“Ye have seen what I did unto the Egyptians, and how I bare you on eagles’ wings, and brought you unto myself.”

- Deuteronomy 32:11–12

“As an eagle stirreth up her nest, fluttereth over her young, spreadeth abroad her wings, taketh them, beareth them on her wings: So the LORD alone did lead him, and there was no strange god with him.”

- Job 39:27–30

“Doth the eagle mount up at thy command, and make her nest on high? She dwelleth and abideth on the rock, upon the crag of the rock, and the strong place. From thence she seeketh the prey, and her eyes behold afar off. Her young ones also suck up blood: and where the slain are, there is she. Doth the hawk fly by thy wisdom, and stretch her wings toward the south?”

- Psalm 91:4

“He shall cover thee with his feathers, and under his wings shalt thou trust: his truth shall be thy shield and buckler.”

- Proverbs 30:18–19

“There be three things which are too wonderful for me, yea, four which I know not: ... The way of an eagle in the air; the way of a man with a maid; the way of a ship in the midst of the sea, and the way of a man with a maid.”

- Isaiah 31:5

“As birds flying, so will the LORD of hosts defend Jerusalem; defending also he will deliver it; and passing over he will preserve it.”

• Isaiah 40:31

“But they that wait upon the LORD shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings as eagles; they shall run, and not be weary; and they shall walk, and not faint.”

• Jeremiah 4:13

“Behold, he shall come up as clouds, and his chariots shall be as a whirlwind: his horses are swifter than eagles...”

• Lamentations 4:19

“Our persecutors are swifter than the eagles of the heaven: they pursued us on the mountains, they laid wait for us in the wilderness.”

• Hosea 8:1

“Set the trumpet to thy mouth. He shall come as an eagle against the house of the LORD, because they have transgressed my covenant, and trespassed against my law.”

• Deuteronomy 28:49 (not literally “eagle” as a blessing — this verse refers to foreigners; include if you want contrasts — usually not an “eagle” passage)

• Ezekiel 1:10

“As for the likeness of their faces, they four had the face of a man, and the face of a lion, on the right side: and they four had the face of an ox on the left side; they four also had the face of an eagle.”

- Ezekiel 10:14

“And every one had four faces: the first face was the face of a cherub, and the second the face of a man, and the third the face of a lion, and the fourth the face of an eagle.”

- Ezekiel 17:3–6 (and following)

“Say now to the rebellious house, Know ye not what these things mean?... A great eagle with great wings, longwinged, full of feathers, which had divers colours, came unto Lebanon, and took the highest branch of the cedar...”

- Matthew 24:28

“For wheresoever the carcase is, there will the eagles be gathered together.”

- Luke 17:37

“And they answered and said unto him, ‘Where, Lord?’ And he said unto them, ‘Wheresoever the body is, thither will the eagles be gathered together.’”

- Revelation 12:14

“And to the woman were given two wings of a great eagle, that she might fly into the wilderness...”

- Revelation 8:13 (textual note)

Some ancient manuscripts and translations render Rev 8:13 as “an eagle” flying in midheaven calling woes; other manuscripts read “an angel.” (KJV reads “angel.”) Whether “angel” or “eagle,” the image of an aerial herald is used.

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11. Introduction

Brief welcome and testimony: God is calling a people to ascend — not by self-effort, but by the Lord's power. This message ties biblical eagle imagery to the Apostolic Pentecostal experience: water baptism in Jesus' Name, Baptism in the Holy Ghost with the evidence of speaking in tongues, a life of holiness, and being seated with Christ.

### 2. Opening Scripture Readings (congregation or reader)

- Exodus 19:4
- Isaiah 40:31
- Colossians 3:1 (to connect the eagle imagery to

being seated in Christ): “If ye then be risen with Christ, seek those things which are above...”

- Acts 2:4 and Acts 2:38 (to anchor the Pentecostal/Apostolic practice)

### 3. Theme Statement

- The Lord calls a remnant of “eagle saints” — a people who will be lifted on eagles’ wings into heavenly places in the Spirit, who will live separated in holiness, be armed for spiritual warfare, and operate in the gifts and authority given by Christ.

### 4. Exposition: The Eagle in Scripture — short meditations

- Exodus 19:4 / Deut 32:11–12 — God carries, nurtures, and trains His people. The eagle lifts the young; the Lord lifts us out of Egypt (sin) onto heavenly ground.
- Isaiah 40:31 — The result of waiting on the Lord: renewed strength; mounting up with wings as eagles. This is not self-exaltation but God-given stamina.
- Job 39:27–30 — The eagle’s instinct, nest placement, sight, and hunt teach us about spiritual focus, high places of intimacy, and vision for prey (harvest).
- Psalm 91:4 — Under His wings is safety. The eagle imagery offers both strength for service and shelter

in storms.

- Proverbs 30:18–19 — The eagle’s way in the air is a divine mystery; God’s ways of elevating His people are wondrous.
- Ezekiel (1:10; 10:14) — The eagle image is used of heavenly beings and vision — a sign the eagle is a creature of the Spirit realm.
- Revelation 12:14 — The imagery of wings for flight in times of persecution: God provides supernatural escape and preservation to fulfill His plan.
- Matthew 24:28 / Luke 17:37 — The eagle as a symbol in eschatological judgment; eagles gather where there is a carcass. A reminder: we must be alive in Christ, not spiritually dead.

## 5. Sermon Points (outline with scripture backing)

Point I — Identity: “You are eagle saints” (Colossians 3:1; Ephesians 2:6)

- We are seated with Christ in heavenly places (Eph 2:6), called to a heavenly identity, not defined by earthly status.
- Illustration: God “bore you on eagles’ wings” (Exod 19:4; Deut 32:11).

Point II — Empowerment: Strength to Rise (Isa 40:31; Acts 1:8)

- Waiting on the Lord brings renewed strength; the Baptism in the Holy Ghost empowers our ascent.
- Evidence: speaking in tongues as the initial sign (Acts 2:4; Acts 10:44–46).

Point III — Holiness & Separation: Eagles don't peck with chickens

- Eagles feed on fresh prey, roost on high places, don't mingle with low birds—an exhortation to live separated from worldliness (1 Peter 2:9–12; Romans 12:1–2).
- Sanctification in heart and life allows us to remain at the high place.

Point IV — Vision & Warfare: Eyes on the prey (Job 39:27–30; Eph 6)

- Eagles have piercing sight — spiritual vision is required to see the harvest and the enemy's tactics.
- We must apply spiritual armor and authority (Eph 6) and be lifted by the Spirit to see afar off.

Point V — Preservation & Providence: Wings in the wilderness (Revelation 12:14; Psalm 91:4)

- God provides supernatural covering and deliverance in seasons of trial; He moves His people to fulfill destiny.

## Point VI — Endurance & Mystery (2 Corinthians 12:2–10 reference)

- Paul’s vision of heaven and his thorn: glory and suffering coexist. Few are caught up (2 Cor 12:3), but grace is sufficient. The eagle saint endures by grace.

## 6. Practical Steps to Soar (application & discipleship)

- A. Pursue intimacy: daily prayer, fasting, and Bible study (Colossians 2:6–7). Cultivate the “high place” of prayer.
- B. Water baptism in Jesus’ Name: obedience to Christ (Acts 2:38; Matthew 28:19–20 applied Apostolically).
- C. Seek the Baptism in the Holy Ghost and fire: expect tongues and power to witness and worship (Acts 2:4; Acts 1:8).
- D. Holiness: separate from worldliness (1 Peter 2:9–12). Avoid compromise; be a holy remnant.
- E. Training and mentorship: elders and spiritual fathers to train eagle young ones (Deut 32:11 model).
- F. Engage in kingdom service: evangelism, discipleship, and spiritual gifts in order (1 Cor 12–14; Romans 12).

## 7. Altar Call / Prayer of Consecration (sample)

- Invite seekers to come forward for water baptism

in Jesus' Name, to receive the Holy Ghost, or to consecrate for holiness and service. Pray for tongues, fresh wings, and a greater thirst for the Lord.

### Sample Prayer:

“Lord Jesus, lift Your people on eagles’ wings. We repent, we consecrate, we obey in baptism in Jesus’ Name. Send forth the Holy Ghost and fire. Renew our strength that we may mount up as eagles, to run and not be weary. Make us a remnant of holy, powerful eagle saints for Your glory. In Jesus’ Name, Amen.”

## 8. Worship / Ministry Time Suggestions

- Begin with a short worship set focused on God’s presence, then an exhortation; follow with altar ministry: baptism, Holy Ghost prayer, personal ministry for deliverance/cleansing.
- Suggested worship songs (general ideas): songs about the Spirit, renewal, being lifted, God’s wings/covering.

## 9. Small-Group Questions & Personal Reflection

- What does “seated with Christ in heavenly places” mean for my daily life?
- Where do I need to repent and separate to rise higher spiritually?
- Have I been baptized in Jesus’ Name? Have I sought

the Baptism in the Holy Ghost?

- How can my small group help each other to “mount up with wings as eagles”?

## 10. Benediction & Further Reading

- Benediction based on Isaiah 40:31 & Ephesians 2:6: “May you be renewed, may you mount up with wings as eagles, and may Christ be enthroned in your heart.”
- Suggested reading: Acts through Revelation (study of Pentecost & spiritual gifts), Paul’s epistles (Romans, Ephesians, Colossians), Ezekiel (for spiritual vision).

## Closing exhortation

The Lord desires a people who will not fly low. Be audacious in holiness, expect the Spirit, and obey in baptism. Let us become eagle saints — a people raised into the high places of Christ, living and preaching the power of God.
