


Introduction

Romans 8:9-24; 26-27, Romans 5:5, Romans 6:1-23, Galatians 2:20, Galatians 3:13-14; 26-28, Galatians 4:4-7, Ephesians 1:13-14; 19, Ephesians 2:1-9, Ephesians 3:10-16; 23.)
- The bible is clear that your not born of the water and spirit until you obey Acts 2:38 and experience

Acts 2:38-41, Matthew 3:11, 1 Corinthians 14:1-3, 1 Corinthians 14:21, Titus 3:5, 1 Corinthians 3:17, and 1 Corinthians 6:10-19. The Bible is clear about the Apostles Doctrine.

There is just one spirit and that eternal spirit is Jesus who is Jehovah! The name of God is Jesus.
