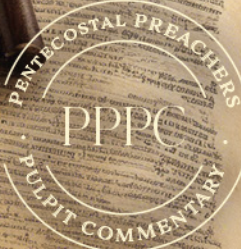

100 LAWS OF *Sowing & Reaping*

1. Galatians 6:7-9 - “Do not be deceived: God cannot be mocked. A man reaps what he sows.”
2. 2 Corinthians 9:6-7 - “Remember this: Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows generously will also reap generously.”
3. Luke 6:38 - “Give, and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together and running over, will be poured into your lap.”
4. Matthew 13:3-9 - Parable of the Sower.
5. Proverbs 11:24-25 - “One person gives freely, yet gains even more; another withholds unduly, but comes to poverty.”
6. Ecclesiastes 11:1-2 - “Cast your bread upon the waters, for after many days you will find it again.”
7. Malachi 3:10 - “Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house.”
8. Philippians 4:19 - “And my God will meet all your needs according to the riches of his glory in Christ Jesus.”

– Principles (Laws) of Sowing and Reaping –

1. Law of Reciprocity: What you give will come back to you (Luke 6:38).

8. Law of Stewardship: Being faithful with little leads to greater opportunities (Luke 16:10).
9. Law of Blessing Others: Giving to those in need is a form of service to God (Proverbs 19:17).

10. Law of Abundance: God's resources are limitless; He provides for those who give (Malachi 3:10).
