FAITH IN ACTION IS THE KEY TO THE DOOR

Written by Pastor Keith Joel Walker The theme of faith being demonstrated through action is prevalent throughout both the Old and New Testaments. Below is a list of examples from the Gospels, particularly focusing on the verses you mentioned, as well as notable Old Testament figures who put their faith into action and experienced divine results.

New Testament Examples of Faith in Action

1. Mark 2:1-10 - The Paralytic Man

• Context: A paralyzed man is brought to Jesus by four friends. They remove the roof of the house where Jesus is teaching to lower him down.

• Action: Their determination and faith led them to take drastic measures to reach Jesus, demonstrating that faith is active and persistent.

• Result: Jesus forgives the man's sins and heals him, showing that their faith was instrumental in the miracle.

• Fable/Analogy: Like a team of climbers who risk everything to reach the summit, their unity and determination led to a miraculous encounter.

2. Mark 5:25-34 - The Woman with the Issue of Blood

• Context: A woman who had been suffering from a bleeding disorder for twelve years hears about Jesus and believes He can heal her.

• Action: She pushes through the crowd to touch

Jesus' garment, believing that even a touch would heal her.

• Result: Jesus acknowledges her faith and tells her, "Daughter, your faith has healed you. Go in peace and be freed from your suffering."

• Fable/Analogy: Like a river carving its way through rock, her relentless pursuit of healing illustrates that faith can overcome even the most daunting obstacles.

3. Mark 10:46-52 - Blind Bartimaeus

• Context: Bartimaeus, a blind beggar, hears that Jesus is passing by and begins to shout for Him.

- Action: Despite being told to be quiet, Bartimaeus shouts even louder, demonstrating his faith and determination to be heard.
- Result: Jesus calls him over, asks what he wants, and restores his sight, commending his faith.
- Fable/Analogy: Like a lighthouse in a storm, his cries for help pierced through the noise, guiding him to the light of healing.

4. Matthew 14:28-31 - Peter Walking on Water

- Context: The disciples see Jesus walking on water and are afraid. Peter asks to walk on the water to Jesus.
- Action: Peter steps out of the boat and walks on the water towards Jesus.
- Result: While he begins to sink when he doubts, Jesus catches him, illustrating that faith in action can

lead to miraculous experiences.

• Fable/Analogy: Like a bird taking its first flight, Peter's leap into the unknown exemplifies the courage to act on faith despite fear.

5. Luke 17:11-19 - The Ten Lepers

• Context: Ten lepers call out to Jesus for mercy, and He tells them to show themselves to the priests.

• Action: They begin to go to the priests as

instructed, demonstrating their faith in His word.

• Result: As they go, they are healed, showing that their action based on faith led to their healing.

• Fable/Analogy: Like seeds planted in fertile soil, their faith took root as they moved forward, resulting in abundant healing.

Old Testament Examples of Faith in Action

1. Abraham - Genesis 12:1-4

• Context: God calls Abraham to leave his homeland and go to a land He will show him.

• Action: Abraham obeys and leaves without knowing where he is going.

• Result: He becomes the father of many nations and is blessed by God.

• Fable/Analogy: Like a sailor setting out to sea without a map, Abraham's faith was his compass, guiding him to a promised future.

2. Moses - Exodus 14:13-22

• Context: The Israelites are trapped between the Red Sea and the pursuing Egyptian army.

• Action: Moses raises his staff and stretches out his hand over the sea.

• Result: The sea parts, allowing the Israelites to cross on dry ground.

• Fable/Analogy: Like a shepherd leading his flock through a storm, Moses' faith created a pathway where none seemed possible.

3. Joshua - Joshua 6:1-20

• Context: God commands Joshua to march around the walls of Jericho.

• Action: Joshua and the Israelites obey God's command, marching around the city for seven days.

• Result: On the seventh day, the walls of Jericho fall, allowing them to conquer the city.

• Fable/Analogy: Like a drumbeat heralding a new dawn, their faithful footsteps resonated with divine purpose, leading to victory.

4. Rahab - Joshua 2:1-21; 6:22-25

• Context: Rahab hides the Israelite spies and helps them escape.

• Action: She puts her faith in the God of Israel and protects the spies.

• Result: She and her family are spared during the conquest of Jericho and become part of the lineage of

Jesus.

• Fable/Analogy: Like a rose blooming in a desert, Rahab's faith flourished amidst adversity, leading to her salvation.

5. David - 1 Samuel 17:45-50

- Context: David faces Goliath, the Philistine giant.
- Action: David approaches Goliath with only a sling and stones, declaring his faith in God.
- Result: He defeats Goliath, demonstrating that faith in action can overcome great odds.

• Fable/Analogy: Like a small stone striking a mighty giant, David's faith became the catalyst for triumph against fearsome challenges.

6. Elijah - 1 Kings 18:36-39

- Context: Elijah challenges the prophets of Baal on Mount Carmel.
- Action: He calls on God to send fire from heaven to consume his sacrifice.
- Result: God answers, demonstrating His power and leading the people to turn back to Him.

• Fable/Analogy: Like a spark igniting a dry forest, Elijah's faith kindled a revival among the people.

7. Daniel - Daniel 6:10-23

• Context: Daniel continues to pray to God despite a decree against it.

• Action: He openly prays to God, trusting in His

protection.

• Result: God protects Daniel in the lions' den, and he is unharmed.

• Fable/Analogy: Like a lighthouse standing firm against crashing waves, Daniel's faith shone brightly, guiding him through peril.

8. The Widow of Zarephath - 1 Kings 17:8-16

• Context: Elijah visits a widow during a famine and asks for food.

• Action: The widow, despite having very little, obeys and makes a meal for Elijah first.

• Result: Her flour and oil do not run out, demonstrating God's provision.

• Fable/Analogy: Like a small flame that refuses to be extinguished, her faith sustained her through the darkest days.

9. Job - Job 1:20-22

• Context: Job loses his wealth and children in a series of calamities.

• Action: He worships God and does not curse Him.

• Result: His faithfulness leads to restoration and blessings later in life.

• Fable/Analogy: Like a tree bending in the storm, Job's faith remained unbroken, allowing him to flourish anew.

10. Esther - Esther 4:15-16

• Context: Esther risks her life to approach the king on behalf of her people.

• Action: She declares a fast and prepares to go before the king.

• Result: Her bravery leads to the salvation of the Jewish people.

• Fable/Analogy: Like a brave knight facing a dragon, Esther's courage and faith opened the door to deliverance.

Poetic Metaphorical Meanings

• Faith as a Seed: Faith is like a seed planted in the soil of our hearts; with action, it grows into a mighty tree bearing fruit.

• Action as the Wind: Action is the wind that carries the sails of faith; without it, the ship remains anchored in the harbor of doubt.

• Faith and Action as Dance Partners: Faith and action are dance partners, twirling together in the ballroom of life, creating a beautiful symphony of purpose and destiny.

• The Key and the Door: Faith is the door, and action is the key; together, they unlock the treasures of heaven and the blessings that God has in store for those who believe.
