Introduction

Is your faith broken? The Bible teaches that faith is not only belief but a living, breathing spirit—born of hearing God’s Word (Romans 10:17). The Lord Jesus demonstrated again and again that the spoken Word carries power: when He spoke, sickness left, demons fled, the dead rose. If your faith has been shaken, this booklet will help you recover it—by feeding your spirit, hearing and meditating on Scripture, and learning to speak the Word of faith until your miracle manifests.

What Is Faith?

- Faith is a spiritual force (the “spirit of faith”) that responds to God’s Word. It is produced in the heart as we hear the hearing of Christ (Romans 10:17).
- God is Spirit; Jesus is the incarnate Word (John 1). Faith links our spirit with God’s creative power.
- The Word becomes effective when received into the inward man: “faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the word of God” (Romans 10:17). Feed your spirit with that Word.

The Power of the Spoken Word

- Scripture shows Jesus speaking and the spoken command producing immediate results: unclean spirits obeyed, the sick were made whole, the dead came forth. Examples: “Talitha cumi” (Mark 5:41), “Lazarus, come forth” (John 11:43), “Woman, thou art loosed” (Luke 13:12), “I will; be thou clean” (Mark 1:41).
- The Word of faith is not mere sentiment. It is a declaration grounded in the revealed Word of God. Jesus taught authority in speech; He did not hesitate to command by name.
- We are called to speak the same Name and use the same Word. The New Testament teaches salvation in the name of Jesus (Acts 4:12), baptism in the name

of Jesus Christ (Acts 2:38), and the power of God working through the spoken, faith-filled declaration.

How to Get Your Faith Back — Practical Steps

Feed your spirit daily:

- Hear apostolic Pentecostal preaching of the Word of faith. Romans 10:17—make daily hearing a priority.
- Read, memorize, and meditate on Scripture (Joshua 1:8). Hide the Word in your heart so it rises in your mouth.

Confess the Word:

- Speak scriptural declarations about your need (Mark 11:22-23; Romans 4:16-17). Speak until you see manifestation.
- Use present-tense, personal, biblical declarations: “By Jesus’ stripes I am healed” (Isaiah 53; 1 Peter 2:24), “I walk in divine health,” “I receive my miracle now.”

Pray in the Spirit:

- Ask the Holy Ghost for the supernatural gift of faith (1 Corinthians 12). Let the Spirit strengthen your inner man (Ephesians 3:16).
- Pray in tongues to build up your spirit (1 Corinthians 14:4).

Act on belief:

- Obey God’s instructions even when you don’t see the outcome (Luke 17:14—go show yourselves to the priests).
- Baptism in the name of Jesus Christ (Acts 2:38) and walking in newness of life are part of living faith.

Be persistent:

- Speak continually until the miracle manifests (Romans 4:17; Mark 11:23). What you don’t use you lose—exercise your spirit.

How to Speak the Word of Faith — Daily Practices and Confessions

Daily routine:

- Morning: Read and declare a passage (e.g., Psalm 103, Isaiah 53, Mark 11:22–24). Pray in tongues for 10–20 minutes.
- Midday: Speak two or three faith declarations about your need. Meditate and memorize one verse.
- Evening: Review evidence of God’s movement; thank God; confess victory.

Sample declarations:

- “In the name of Jesus Christ, my body is healed. By Jesus’ stripes I am restored now.”
- “I speak to this situation: it must obey the name

of Jesus. According to God’s Word, I receive my miracle.”

- “Holy Ghost, fill me afresh. Give me the gift of faith to move mountains for God’s glory.”

Use the Name:

- Invoke the Name of the Lord Jesus Christ in prayer and authority (Acts 4:12; Philippians 2:10). The name is not a magic word, but it is the authority of the resurrected Christ.

Apostolic Pentecostal Emphasis

- New birth by water and Spirit: Acts 2:38 teaches repentance, baptism in Jesus’ name, and receiving the Holy Ghost. This experience empowers the believer to walk in the Spirit and exercise gifts, including faith.
- Water baptism in the name of Jesus is a step of obedience and identification with Christ (Acts 2:38; Acts 4:12).
- Expect the Holy Ghost to produce fruit and gifts that manifest God’s power in your life.

Closing Exhortation

Is your faith broken? Feed your spirit with Scripture.

Hear the Word. Speak the Word. Stand on the Word. Ask the Holy Ghost for the gift of faith. Use the Name of Jesus. Speak until you see the manifestation. The same Jesus who said, “Be thou clean” and “Lazarus, come forth” is Lord of your need today.

Appendix — Gospel Cases Where Jesus Spoke and People Were Healed or Raised

(Recorded instances in the four Gospels where Jesus spoke words directly or gave spoken commands that resulted in healing or resurrection; Scripture references are given so you can read the accounts.)

- A leper healed — Mark 1:40–42; Matthew 8:2–3; Luke 5:12–13
- The centurion’s servant healed by Jesus’ word — Matthew 8:5–13; Luke 7:1–10
- Peter’s mother-in-law healed of fever — Matthew 8:14–15; Mark 1:29–31; Luke 4:38–39
- The paralytic healed (lowered through the roof) — Matthew 9:1–8; Mark 2:1–12; Luke 5:17–26 (Jesus: “Arise, take up thy bed, and go home.”)
- Woman with the issue of blood — Matthew 9:20–22; Mark 5:25–34; Luke 8:43–48 (“Daughter, thy faith hath made thee whole.”)
- Jairus’ daughter raised — Matthew 9:18–26; Mark 5:21–43 (Mark 5:41 “Talitha cumi.”); Luke 8:40–56

- Two blind men healed — Matthew 9:27–31
- Blind man at Bethsaida — Mark 8:22–26
- Bartimaeus healed — Mark 10:46–52; Luke 18:35–43; Matthew 20:29–34 (“Go; thy faith hath made thee whole.”)
- Nobleman’s son (Cana) healed at distance — John 4:46–54 (Jesus: “Go; thy son liveth.”)
- Man at the pool of Bethesda healed — John 5:1–9 (“Rise, take up thy bed, and walk.”)
- Man born blind healed (told to wash in Siloam) — John 9:1–7
- Man with a withered hand — Matthew 12:9–13; Mark 3:1–5; Luke 6:6–10 (“Stretch forth thy hand.”)
- Woman bound by infirmity 18 years — Luke 13:10–13 (“Woman, thou art loosed.”)
- Ten lepers cleansed (told to show themselves to the priests) — Luke 17:11–19
- Demoniac in Capernaum (unclean spirit commanded) — Mark 1:23–27; Luke 4:33–36
- Gadarenes’ demoniac(s) — Mark 5:1–20; Luke 8:26–39 (Jesus commanded the spirit)
- Widow’s son at Nain raised — Luke 7:11–17 (“Young man, I say unto thee, Arise.”)
- Lazarus raised — John 11:38–44 (“Lazarus, come forth.”)
- Many healings summarized — Matthew 4:23–25; Matthew 8:16–17; Mark 1:32–34 (Jesus healed many and cast out many demons by word and touch)

Notes on the list

- Gospel writers record many instances; the above are the primarily recorded episodes where Jesus spoke and the result was immediate healing or resurrection.
- Jesus sometimes healed by touch or action as well as by spoken command; in many cases His spoken instruction accompanied the healing.
- Not every healing account records the exact words, but the listed passages are clear examples of Jesus speaking and producing results.

A Prayer to Restore Your Faith

Lord Jesus, I thank You that You are the same yesterday, today, and forever. I receive Your Word into my spirit. Fill me with the Holy Ghost and grant me the spirit of faith.
